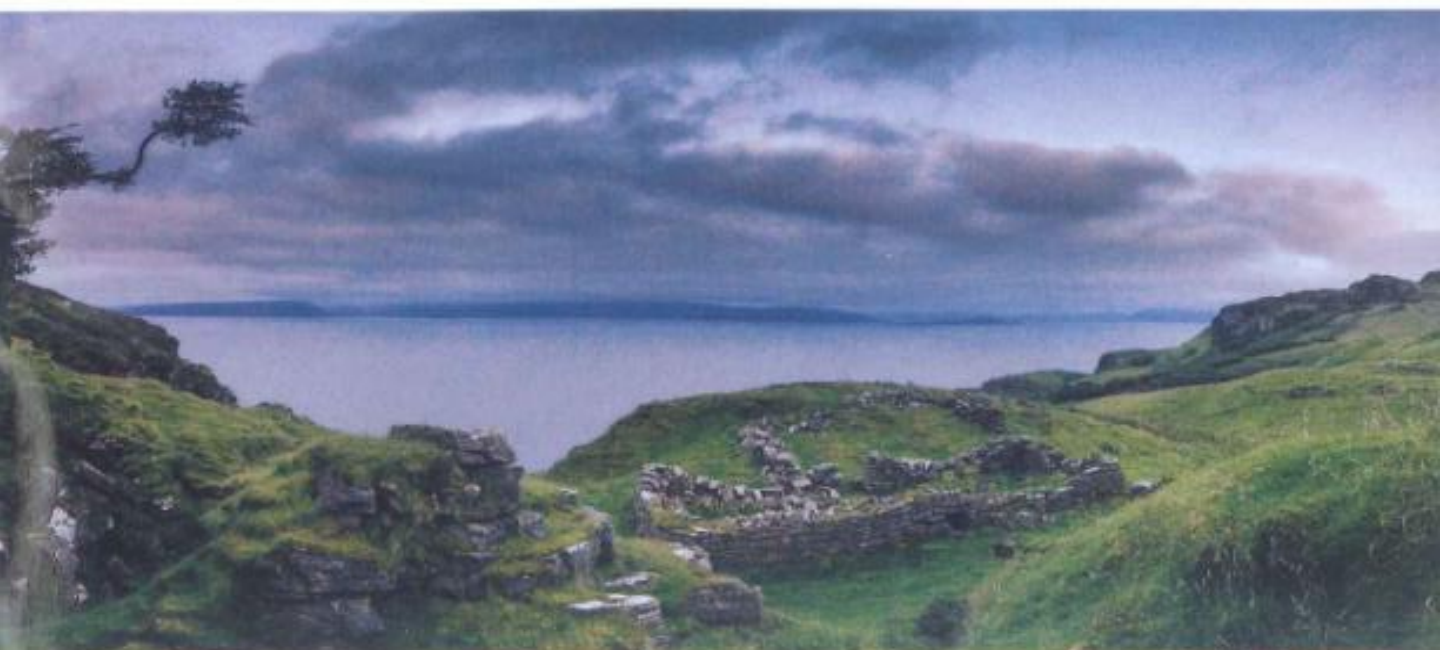

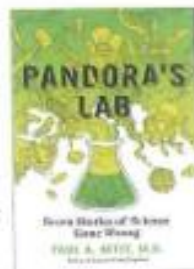
NURTURING WILDLIFE WITH BANDIT PATROL
