Liquefied Petroleum Gases (often referred to as LPG or LPGas) are a constituent of crude oil. They are the propane (referred to this project), which have the property of being gassed at normal ambient temperature but can be liquefied and kept in the liquid state by quiet moderate pressure. Gases released from crude oil are called associated gases' while those found without heavier hydrocarbons are known as 'unassociated gases'.
