

Inti's Master's Management programme

INTI College recently signed a memorandum of understanding with Australia's University of Wollongong to offer the Master of Quality Management Programme.

Signing on behalf of Inti College was its vice-president of administration Dr Lee Fah Onn while the University of Wollongong was represented by its business school director Prof John J. Glynn. Also present was Dr Ibrahim Ahmad Bajunid, director of Institut Aminuddin Baki and member of the Inti College academic advisory board.

The programme offers studies in modern management and productivity improvement concepts and techniques. The primary aim of the programme is to increase participants' awareness of quality in their workplace. The programme can be utilised by anyone interested in improving the operations of an organisation.

The course is conducted on a part-

time basis and can be completed in 16 months. Participants are also required to attend on-site instructional blocks at the college.

"An attractive aspect of the programme will be local input from experienced Inti lecturers and practitioners from local industries offer a Malaysian perspective, experience and insight," he added.

Glynn in his address said quality

management no longer focused only on the manufacturing sector but has proved to be an important aspect in all fields including banking and finance, food and beverage, health and hospitals, telecommunication and education.

The first intake for the Master's programme is expected to begin early next year after approval is from the Education Ministry. Candidates should possess either an undergraduate degree from a recognised university or institution of equivalent standing or other post-secondary qualification plus a total of five years experience, with at least two are in the quality management area.

This is the second Master's programme that Inti College is offering. The college has another course in Master's of Business Administration, in collaboration with the University of Missouri Kansas City.
