## Inti College get-together to celebrate success of 40

**F**ORTY engineering students who graduated recently with first class honours were feted by Inti College at a get-together at the main campus in Bandar Baru Nilai, Negri Sembilan.

The graduates, formerly under the Inti College twinning programme, comprised students of the University of Leeds, University of Liverpool, University of Birmingham, University of Manchester and University of Nottingham in the United Kingdom.

College senior vice-president Dr Lee Fah Onn said the remarkable achievement of these students was the hallmark of Inti's insistence on the quality approach in learning.

First class honours recipient Wong Shio Yun, a civil engineering major from the University of Manchester, has several awards under her belt.

A former Excellence Award holder from Inti College, Wong was the

only student in the Manchester School of Engineering to have been conferred the A.H. Gibson Prize in her second year.

For the final year, she was given the Jack Allen Prize and Edgar Morton Prize in recognition of her excellent performance in fluid mechanics and geotechnics, respectively.

Beside these, Wong had recently won the Institution of Civil Engineering Prize for best overall performance in civil engineering.

Twenty-year-old Wong said the driving force behind her remarkable result was her belief in giving her best in whatever she does and enjoying what life has to offer.

She will be leaving for United Kingdom to pursue her Ph D in civil engineering at the end of the year.

Other than Wong, five other first class honours students were also given special prizes by their respective universities for their excellence.
