

INTI students do Alma Mater proud

Partner universities sing praises of its graduates

FOR over 14 years, INTI College has established a tradition of excellence and a long-standing record of achievements.

Officials from several prestigious universities in the UK were full of praise for INTI's Engineering students who achieved excellent results.

Professor Sir Martin Harris, vice-chancellor of the University of Manchester, said INTI students have achieved spectacular success in their degree examinations.

Of the 22 students who graduated in July, 50 per cent secured first class honours.

In results recently released by INTI College's partner universities in the UK — University of Leeds, University of Birmingham, University of Nottingham and University of Manchester — a total of 40 INTI Engineering students from these universities excelled in their academic endeavour by graduating with first class honours.

"It is not everyday that an institution produces high achievers with remarkable academic calibre," said Dr Lee Fah Onn, senior vice-president of INTI College.

Wong Shio Yun, a first class honours graduate with a Civil Engineering major from the University of Manchester, was the only student in the Manchester School of Engineering to have been conferred the A H Gibson Prize, a top student prize in her second year.

In her final year, she was given the Jack Allen Prize and Edgar Morton Prize in recognition of her excellent performance in

Fluid Mechanics and Geotechnics respectively.

She also won the Institution of Civil Engineering Prize for best overall performance in Civil Engineering.

Another award recipient was Jerry Wong who did INTI College and his family proud when he was awarded first class honours in the Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering from the University of Manchester.

His string of achievements include winning the Bae Systems Matra Dynamics Prize, The ImachE Best Projects Certificate, Fairbairn Engineering Prize, LMS Prize and Institutional of Mechanical Engineers — Federic Barns Waldron Prize. Wong has been given a scholarship to pursue his PhD in Non-Linear Dynamics.

Five other first class honours students were also awarded special prizes by their universities.

Lo Ellis Ket How, who majored in Engineering from the University of Liverpool, won the Bachy Prize for Geotechnical Engineering. Liew Vui Lee, also a Civil Engineering major from the University of Liverpool, received the Bingham Design and the Nina Camero Civil Engineering prizes from the University of Nottingham, won the Institution of Civil Engineering prize (for top student) and the Scott Wilson Pavement Design Prize respectively.

Khoo Chang Lok, who despite being visually impaired, named a first class honours recipient at the University of Liverpool.
