

## Two days of graduation do at Inti

CONVOCATION at Inti this year was done in three sessions over two days due to the large number of students graduating.

One thousand two hundred and seventy eight students received their degrees and diplomas.

Of these, 568 graduated with full degrees while the rest received their diplomas and higher diplomas from the British, Australia, New Zealand and American University Programme.

A total of 13 students obtained First Class Honours in various disciplines while 315 students received Sec-

ond Class honours from the University of Hertfordshire. Another 158 received Second Class honours from Coventry University.

Lim Bee Hon, 22, who received a First Class Honours degree in Business Administration from the University of Hertfordshire, said that she found the programme interesting and the course structure well-organised.

Tee Choon Yen, who achieved First Class Honours in Business Information Technology from Coventry University also received the Business Project
