

Inti College volleyball champions

THE Inti College volleyball team reign supreme after beating seven other teams in the recent annual Mapco tournament.

The students proved their talent on the volleyball court after beating Sunway 3-0 in the final. The other teams which took part were Nilai College, Kolej Damansara Utama, Terengganu Advance Technical Institute, Sedaya College and HELP Institute.

Inti students also took first place in both the men's and women's category of the Mapco-Hiking Tournament. This may have something to do with Inti being represented by some very talented runners, including Lee Choon Liang and Tan Hui Ping who are state runners for Perak and Johor respectively.

The annual Mapco tournament, sees the participation of various higher learning institutions in the country. The tournament comprises 10 sporting events organised by private colleges.

Dubbed a 30-hour Famine Camp, an education-cum-fund raising event organised by Inti together with World Vision International and *Sin Chew Jit Poh* saw participants sleeping on mats on the floor and pledging to go without solid food for 30 hours while undergoing educational sessions.

The event also saw Deputy Education Minister Datuk Hon Choon Kim witnessing a cheque presentation for RM19,000 from Inti College to World Vision.

The funds collected will be channelled to World Vision's projects for the needy in China's Xinjiang province, North Korea's food and agriculture rehabilitation, South Africa's flood victims and the Village Project in Sabah.
