

Famine awareness

STUDENTS and staff of Inti College Malaysia in Negri Sembilan, together with World Vision International and *Sin Chew Jit Poh*, recently took part in a 30-hour Famine Camp, an education cum fund-raising event.

World Vision Board of Trustees deputy chairman Govi Nathan said Inti College was the first college in the country to organise such a camp.

The 200 students and staff

experienced, on a small scale, what millions of victims of war, poverty or natural catastrophes go through worldwide on a daily basis.

The highlight of the 30-hour camp was when the Deputy Minister of Education Datuk Hon Choon Kim paid the campers a visit.

He later witnessed a cheque presentation worth RM19,000 which was handed over by the students to World Vision.
