

Three INTI students make President's list

A TOTAL of 508 students were honoured at the recent Academic Awards Presentations held at INTI College Malaysia and INTI College Subang Jaya recently.

The INTI College Malaysia's Academic Awards Presentation included 333 students who excelled last semester, of which, three students in the American University Programme were placed on the President's List while 49 were awarded the Dean's Honour Roll.

This was an increase of 53 students compared with last semester, and the highest ever.

At INTI College Subang Jaya, 170 students were given awards which were categorised into the President's List, Dean's Honour Roll, Certificate of Excellence and Certificate of Merit.

Four students from the American University Programme at this campus, who scored a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 4.0, were placed on the President's List.
