

INTI College offers Home University Visit option

REALISING that students who take up 3+0 programmes from British universities here will have no idea what their university looks and feels like, INTI College has come up with a Home University Visit programme.

These visits which will be held on a regular basis, are aimed at giving students of INTI's 3+0 programme the opportunity to experience British campus life at their Alma Mater in the United Kingdom.

The visits will also give them an opportunity to meet with the officials from their university and exchange experiences with fellow students, especially Malaysian students currently at these universities.

Eight students from the Coventry and the University of Hertfordshire 3+0 degree programmes took part in the inaugural visit on Jan 31.

The students were accompanied by two staff Archana Nair and Chong Kim Hong.

During their visit to Coventry University, the students met with officials from the School of Mathematics and Information Systems and the international Office.

A dinner party which included students from Hong Kong and China was also held for the Malaysian visitors.

The students also attended a lecture on the project management at the university's lecture theatre and a briefing on the master's programmes offered at the university.

They also toured the campus and the city as well as surrounding places of interest.

The programme was somewhat similar at the University of Hertfordshire's Herford Campus where they also attended a briefing on the campus, its facilities, the master's programmes offered and toured the campus.

London, one of the biggest attractions of the visit, saw the visitors touring attractions like the Underground, Big Ben, Parliament House, Westminster Abbey and the famous Tower Bridge.

Many students proceed to tour other parts of the UK and Europe while some returned home on Feb 4. Due to the success of this trip, INTI will organise a second Home University Visit during the April semester break. — By Jasbir Singh
