

Inti renews ties with Aussie varsity

THE strategic link between Inti College and the University of Tasmania, Australia was further enhanced with a renewal of the agreement for the engineering programme on a 2+2 basis. The original agreement was signed in 1996.

At the signing ceremony, Inti College senior vice-president Dr Lee Fah Onn expressed delight that the working relationship between both institutions had grown in strength and that many Inti students have obtained their degrees at the University of Tasmania.

Professor Rudi Lidl, deputy vice chancellor of the University of Tasmania, said the partnership shared by both institutions was in line with his university's internationalisation efforts.

"The University Council, the governing body of the University of Tasmania, and outside bodies like the State Government, have shown keen interest in the internationalisation of the University of Tasmania," said Lidl.
