
Honorary degree for INTI College president's contributions

INTI College president Tan Yew Sing will be conferred a Honorary Degree of Doctor of Business Administration (HonDBA) for his contribution to international education.

The award is from Coventry University's international associate college.

Commenting on the recipients of this year's honorary degrees, Coventry University Vice-Chancellor Dr Michael Goldstein said: "We are delighted to be acknowledging the outstanding contributions to areas of the university's interests by our new honorary graduates.

"Each has made a mark in a way which improves the quality of life of ordinary people, and we are proud to be associated with them."

For the past 16 years, Tan has brought INTI College to greater heights, establishing its presence in China, Thailand, Indonesia, Vietnam and Hong Kong.

It is believed that today INTI College has the highest number of student enrolment in private colleges totalling about 14,000.

To date, more than 15,000 INTI alumni have graduated from the college since the first graduation in 1988.
