
## Opening up to the world of engineering

INTI College in Subang Jaya, Selangor, recently held an Engineering Today workshop for secondary school students.

The workshop, organised by the college's School of Engineering and technology, was attended by Form 4 and Form 5 students from two Subland Java schools.

The students were shown a video presentation on What Engineers Do and given demonstrations on tensile testing of materials, surveying and motor control by Inti lecturers.

They were also taken on a tour of the Structural and Hydrology laboratory, Civil, Electronic and Electric laboratory, Microprocessor and Communications laboratory and Computer-Aided Design laboratory.

"The workshop was aimed at providing students with a basic understanding of engineering and its contribution to society," said Dr Phoon Chow Lin, head of the School of Engineering and Technology.

The students were given hands-on experience in surveying, motor control and in studying the characteristics of materials.
