GRIT plus perseverance plus sportsmanship - this has once again proven to be the winning formula adopted by Inti College's sportsmen and sportswomen, who emerged overall champions for the third consecutive year at the Malaysian Association of Private Colleges and Universities (Mapcu) Sports Tournament 2002. "This trophy is certainly a reflection of the blood, sweat and tears of the team who gave all they've got," said Inti's sports executive officer Lim Boon Hooi.
