This was the third annual inter-school English Choral Speaking Competition organised by Subang Parade.

The participating schools were SMK SS17, SMK Damansara Jaya, SMK USJ14, SMK (P) Taman Petaling, SMJ K. Kwang Hua, SMK Taman S.E.A, SMK Subang Utama and SMK Seafield.

The winners were evaluated

based on their intonation, pronunciation, organisation, content, voice projection, rhythm & timing and the overall presentation. They were each given 10 minutes to perform.

The Inter-School English Choral Speaking Competition was first organised in 2001 where SMK (P) Taman Petaling was the champion.

The second competition in 2002 was won by SMK Subang Jaya.
