

23 pack into a Kancil to give Inti College another record

KUALA LUMPUR, Fri. — Twenty-three people — 19 students and four staff of Inti College in Subang Jaya — today set a Malaysian record for the “most number of people to squeeze into a Kancil” when they successfully piled into the car.

The event was held in conjunction with the college’s Campus Day and the car squeeze was part of the celebration. Gathered under the blazing sun at the college’s basketball court at approximately 1pm, the participants aged between 19 and 22 and weighing between 38kg and 63kg, made two attempts.

Their first attempt saw 20 people squeeze into the car successfully.

Ten minutes later, they broke their own record after piling in another three to make the number 23.

The Malaysia Book of Records managing director, Datuk Danny Ooi

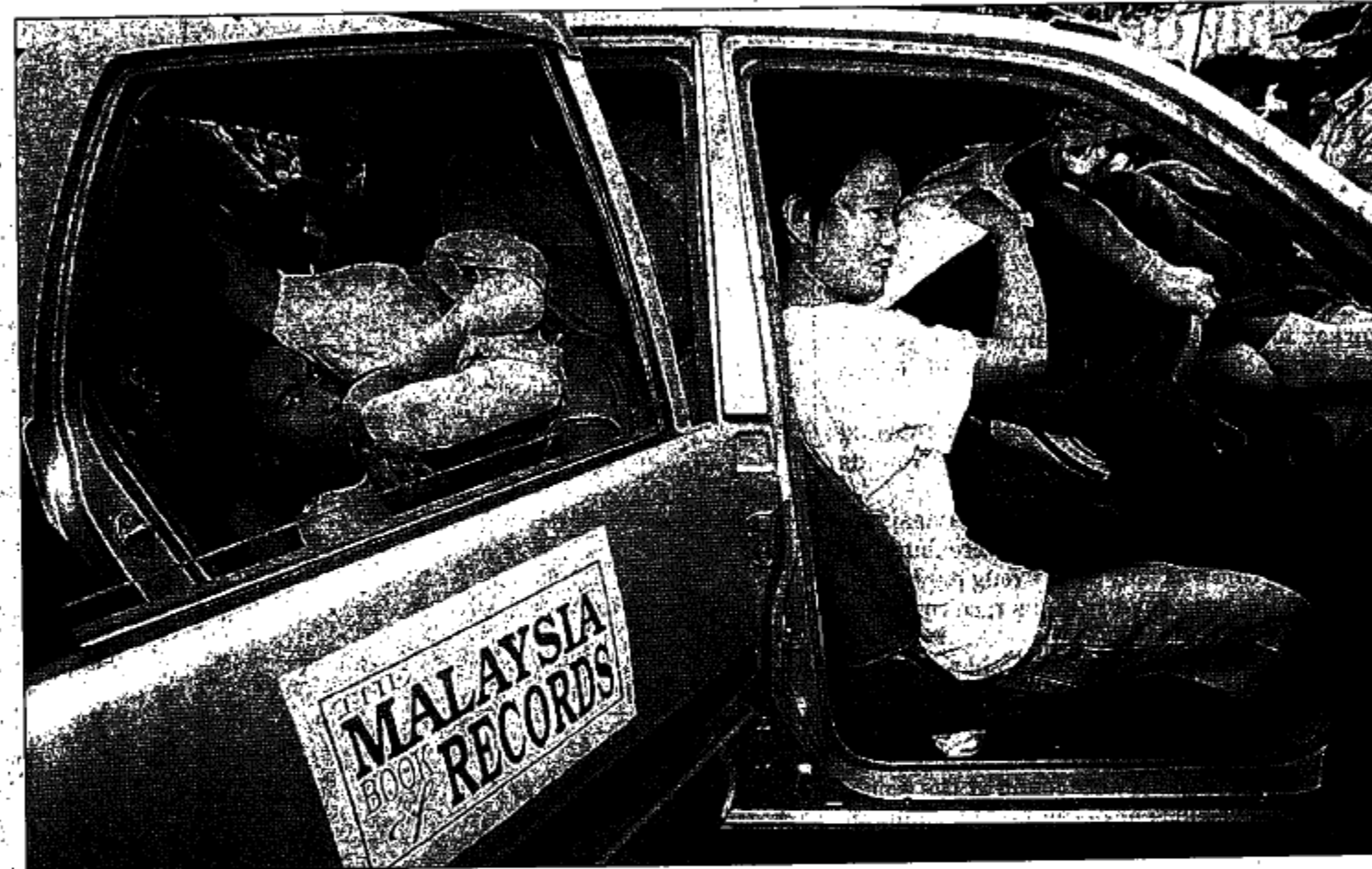
said: “As you can see, it was not easy. I was afraid for the one down below.”

“I’d like to congratulate the students for their record-breaking feat. This is actually the second time Inti College has made it into the Malaysia Book of Records.”

The first record was set last year for the fastest time taken in stacking cans. The college’s student council president, Mah Guang Cheng, 20, said, “When the idea was agreed upon, we contacted Perusahaan OtomobilKedua Sdn Bhd (Perodua) to lend us a car.

“The car arrived yesterday so we only had one practice session.”

The world record for cramming the most number of people into a car was set in Kremser, Australia on April 29, last year when 25 people squeezed themselves into a standard VW Beetle.
