

Top award for Inti girl

WONG El Mane, a student at Inti College in Subang Jaya, Selangor, was recently awarded the Golden Jubilee Scholarship Award by the University of New South Wales for her outstanding performance in the Diploma in Mechanical Engineering programme.

The award, given to the top or second best in the course, is worth RM80,000 to RM90,000, and covers two years' tuition at the university.

She had consistently won the Excellence Award each semester besides winning the Best Project Award for her study of a solar-assisted bicycle.
