INTI-UC sets no limit to scholarships

A GOOD education and quality credentials are important to students.

The means to attain these may, however, be beyond the financial capabilities of some students and parents.

INTI believes in helping students plan their career path and achieve their goals in life by offering opportunities and options for further education, and this includes financial assistance.

For school leavers who scored six As and above in their SPM examination, INTI offers immediate approval for Merit Scholarships, available at INTI International University College in Putra Nilai and INTI College Subang Jaya. The scholarships range from RM200 to full tuition-fee waiver.

Every year, INTI sets no limit to the number of scholarships awarded because it believes there is no limit to one's potential.

Over the past years, INTI has given out RM58 million worth of scholarships.

Eligible students can look forward to help from its partner universities in the United States, Australia, Canada, New Zealand and United Kingdom.

More than 70 US universities offer scholarships to international students.

Out of these, 22 have schol-

arship allocations for INTI students, including Bemidji State University, California State University-Fresno, Michigan Technological University, University of Nebraska Lincoln, Drake University, Indiana University Purdue University Indianapolis, Iowa State University and Mississippi State University.

INTI offers three scholarships: Merit Scholarship, Achievement Scholarship and Sports/Special Talent Scholarship.

Merit Scholarship is awarded to students with good academic results while Achievement Scholarship is given to needy students with good academic results and who are active in extra-curricular activities.

The Sports/Special Talent Scholarship is for students who are state or national players and have fulfilled the minimum entry requirement of a programme.

The amount of scholarships given to students each year speaks volumes of INTI's track record.

In 2003, INTI received two recognitions, each from the UK and the US.

The Quality Assurance Agency (QAA), UK gave INTI top commendable rating for its 3+0 twinning programmes with the University of Hertfordshire and Coventry University.

The report was published after QAA checked on the standards and quality of the programmes.

INTI also became the first tertiary education institution in the country to be awarded the Certificate of Appreciation for Achievement in Trade by the United States Department of Commerce for its multinational co-operation via academic collaboration, and having sent the largest number of students to US universities.

INTI bagged two awards at the Private Higher Education Night 2005 for having the highest enrolment of international students and the highest number of accredited programmes.

This month, students can enrol in the South Australian Matriculation or Foundation Programme (Business/Engineering/Science/IT).

There will be extended counselling until May 13, from 9am to 5pm including weekends and public holidays. It will hold information days on March 24 and 25 from 10am to 5pm.
